Harmonization of Spiritualism with Materialism is Essential

The Yoga of Maharishi Patanjali is extremely significant. It begins when one goes beyond the mind. The real existence of the consciousness is beyond the mind, and by rising above the mind; the individual personality acquires divinity, completeness and all-pervasiveness.

Our mind is characterized by obstinacy, containing painful memories of the past and innumerable fantasies of the future. We want to live in the 'known' and are afraid of the 'unknown element'. That is why we cannot muster the courage to do something new, because the unknown element seems esoteric and mysterious. It is true that only those people, who are brave enough to dive into the 'unknown', can do something innovative in this world. It is only in the 'unknown' that secrets are revealed, self- introspection takes place, and fear, doubts and illusion get

destroyed.

The mind is filled with feelings of self-centeredness and limited thinking. Hence, in order to recognize one's identity with the Great, Infinite and Endless, one has to transcend the levels of consciousness.

We have focused our life on the outside. Home and wealth property, and power possessions, and status, etc are all external forms of focus. From here, begins the journey of decline of life. Generally a person associates himself only with the external aspects of his personality and identity. That is why, he also lays down the criteria for being outwardly happy.

In ancient times, the factors that lead to greatness amongst individuals were character, elevated thinking, perseverance, duty, discipline, effort, and integrity. Today, superficiality and pretentiousness have taken

person having accumulated some material possessions considers that further growth in these assets is the ultimate aim of life. In the end, he repents "Whatever I had attained in life, all that is being forcefully taken away from me. The wealth, status and authority for which I had spent sleepless nights and anxious days, I have to unwillingly leave it all at the time of death."

Realized beings who have known the Ultimate Reality say that the sorrow which such an individual experiences is not of death, but that of having to leave everything behind. Further, he does not know where he

will go after death. The focal point of the philosophy of Indian sages is both 'life and death'. In the contemporary world, we focus only on the 'life' aspect and all the concepts of progress and modern science are centered around life. Man remains frightened of death, which is why he is never ready to think anything about death.

Our culture has never been opposed to materialism, science or progress. But it is also true that we have considered the ultimate goal of our life to be Self-Realization.

The meaning of all this is that without the harmonization of spiritualism with materialism, the hope of a healthy, glorious and happy world will only be a dream.

In reality, you do not live in this world. You dwell in the Lord. It is the body, senses, mind and intellect which live in the world. And you are none of these. You associate yourself with what isn't really yours, while you do not associate yourself with that Supreme Lord who really belongs to you. This is the biggest mistake.

World Summit of Religious Leaders held at Baku

Heads and representatives of the major Christian churches, Muslim, Jewish, Buddhist and Hindu communities from more than thirty two countries worldwide came together to participate in the 'World Summit of Religious Leaders' held on April 26 and 27, 2010 at Baku in Azerbaijan.



Representing the Hindu Dharma Acharya Sabha from India, H.H.Swamiji participated in this two-day Summit, and was accompanied by H.H. Swami Paramatmananda Saraswati Ii.

The Summit was organized

by the Inter-Religious Council of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS).

The main theme of this forum was 'Globalization, religion, traditional values' where the leaders discussed the impact of globalization on religion and traditional values. The objective of this Summit was to discuss the dialogue of civilizations, ways to achieve a peaceful world order, to overcome existing threats, and give a new impetus to interreligious dialogue.

At the end of the Summit, the leaders signed a Final Declaration which states that the globalization of economy, politics, law. culture remains a complex While process. it has brought a number practical benefits to provide answers to the general challenges in many fields,



the impact of global processes on the spiritual sphere is given a negative assessment by many. Moreover, globalization does not eliminate the threats for security of states, nations and people.

The Declaration further speaks about the growing problems of social inequality, starvation, environmental pollution, armed conflict on the national-religious ground which are yet to find their solutions.

In their Declaration, the leaders appealed for the development of interreligious collaboration at all levels and in all formats. Highlighting the importance of such inter-faith dialogue, it states "There was no alternative to inter-religious dialogue in the 20th century, and there is no alternative today. And we, religious leaders, must do everything in our power to preserve peace among nations and peoples."

Ganga Dusshera

'Ganga Dusshera' is a tenday festival celebrated in the the Jyeshta month in June which marks the birthday or the descent of Mother Ganges on the Earth. It is believed that on the 10th day of the Shukla Paksha of the Jyeshta month, the Godess Ganga descended on the earth. In 2010, the date of this festival is June 21, 2010.

According to popular legend, Mother Ganga initially flowed only in heaven. By the arduous penance and austerities performed by Kina Bhagirath, she was brought down to the earth. This is why she is also referred to as 'Bhagirathi'.

However, since the earth was not prepared enough to withstand the Ganga's

strong flow, Lord Shiv was asked to intervene in order to protect the earth from being swept away with her torrential flow. Lord Shiv agreed, and He coolly received the Mother Ganga in his matted locks, allowing her to drip down and fall gently on the plains.

On Ganga Dusshera, many devotees flock to the banks of the Ganga River to take a holy dip. Those who cannot reach the banks of Ganga, pray and worship Gangajal in their homes, and if even this is not possible, then many devotees bathe with ordinary water but mentally invoke the blessings of Mother Ganga through their prayers.

Several worship ceremonies, festivities and rituals are conducted on the banks of



the Ganga during Ganga Dushera

Each day at sunset, Ganga Aarti is performed, and hundreds of leaf boats decorated with colorful flowers, and tiny lamps are set afloat in the River Ganges.

The River Ganga occupies a significant place in lives of Indian people. In the Bhagavad Gita, the Lord Himself proclaims, "Of the flowing rivers, I am the Ganges." A dip in this sacred river done with true faith is said to cleanse one

of all sins. Nearly every home contains a bottle or container of 'Ganga Jal' which is used for the purpose of purification.

Even today, scientists find it difficult to comprehend the sanctity of the Ganga water which distinguishes it from ordinary water. Some research states that there is an unknown or 'mysterious factor' which gives it its selfpurifying quality. ordinary water being kept in airtight containers can get contaminated over time, Ganga Jal does not lose its purity, even if it is kept airtight for years together.

This is the uniqueness and sacredness of this holy River which has blessed mankind since ages.
