Reflections from H.H. Swamiji's Diary...



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
Dear Prabhu Premi,

News in a Nutshell

Hari Om!

The Kumbh Mela, often known to be the world's largest religious festival and gathering of people, is a unique and remarkable feature of the Indian spiritual heritage. This divine event has gained immense popularity not just throughout the

country, but across the entire globe. This year, the Purna Kumbh Mela will take place after a span of 12 years at Prayag (Allahabad), which is situated at *Triveni Sangam* – the confluence of the holy Ganges, Yamuna and Saraswati River.

In the month of December

2012, spiritual discourses were conducted in different cities of India.

In addition, the 'Peshwai' procession or formal entry of the Shri Panchdasnam Juna Akhara into the Kumbh Mela 2013 premises took place on December 18, 2012 at Allahabad.

Satsang - Companionship of the Holy

Satsang plays an extraordinary role in the spiritual advancement of a human being. 'Sat' means noble and 'sang' means company. Together they form the word 'Satsang'. Company of the noble ones, proximity of righteous people has the capacity to ordinary transform an into person an extraordinary individual. In contrast to this, association with negative tendencies fills the mind with negativity.

A person living in the company of those who have a vision of oneness acquires the quality of equanimity. Our religious texts reveal this truth saying,

"Dear One! To live in the company of evil ones grants evil tendencies, and to live in the company of those whose minds are tranquil and balanced bestows the quality of equanimity while the company of distinguished people

bestows great qualities."

It is through great fortune that a person acquires the company of an enlightened being. Whosoever receives such a favorable opportunity, can definitely climb the zenith of success. Then even an ordinary individual can become eligible for great honor.

Leave alone human beings, even plants and animals are seen to obtain such a great opportunity. Take the example of an ordinary conch shell which would generally be considered useless; in the Sanatan tradition, these remnants are considered so pure and of immense deserving respect, to the extent that without the conchshell, the prayer and worship rituals are considered incomplete. is synonymous or with the analogous Satyanarayan katha. The sound of the conch shell is considered extremely divine and beneficial.

On contemplating the reason the conch shell receives great respect; one fact comes to mind - the effect of *Satsang* or holy company. Lord Vishnu has granted the conch shell such a great honor by holding it in His holy hands. This is the cause of its greatness. The glory of holy companionship boundless, hence Gosvami Tulsidasji has said, Ghadi, Aadhi Ghadi, Aadhi ki Puni Aadh, Tulsi Sangat SadhuKi, Hare Koti Apradh."

The proximity of a Realized being, even for a very short time, destroys innumerable sins. That is why it is considered to be one of the three most important attainments. Lord Adi Shankracharya in his scriptural text titled 'Vivek Chudamani' has written:

"Durlabham Trayamevaitat
Devanugraha Hetukam;
Manushyatavam
Mumukshutavam
Mahapurushasanshrayah"

This means - there are three very rare things that are obtained by God's grace. The first one is to have attained this human birth; the second is to be a seeker of the Highest Truth, and thirdly, the protection or guidance of a Realized Master.

On attaining the guidance of a Realized Master, the path of spiritual progress becomes evident. One gets freedom from the heated anxieties and problems of the world when one attains the companionship of saints.

Thus, in order to gain freedom from the three kinds of suffering (material, divine and spiritual), one should come under the refuge of holy beings. Undoubtedly there is no greater means for human welfare than this.

Question: How can we reduce our attraction towards the world?

Answer: A good way to reduce attraction towards worldly objects is that when you experience sense or material objects; try to do so with feelings of detachment. However, when you remember the Lord, chant His name, sing or listen to His glories, do it with immense love and attachment. Just like the color that is added to hot melting wax remains steadfast, similarly when the heart melts and when one is overcome with emotion, then the object of attraction also begins to permanently dwell within.

Peshwai - Official Arrival at the Purna Kumbh Mela 2013

The Peshwai procession, marking the formal entry of the Shri Panchdasnam Juna Akhara into the Kumbh Mela 2013 premises took place amid great fervor and enthusiasm on December 18, 2012 near the holy Sangam, in the city of Allahabad.

Allahabad, which will be the venue for the 2013 Kumbh Mela, is likely to witness an enormous influx of saints, pilgrims, and devotees from across the country and abroad, in the upcoming few weeks.

The Peshwai procession was led by H.H. Swami Avdheshanand Giri Ji Maharaj, the Acharya Mahamandleshwar of the Juna Akhara - the largest and most ancient order of saints in India. Thousands of saints took part in the Peshwai, which included the naga babas, who generally lead a secluded life in mountains. forests and caves, covering themselves with holy ash, and come out only during the Kumbh Mela.

One of the main highlights

of the Kumbh Mela is the ritual bathing or taking a divine dip. It is commonly believed that taking a dip in the holy waters with true feelings of devotion can sanctify an individual and make one fit for liberation, not just from the cycle of birth and death, but rather from all negativities, sorrows, anxieties, undesirable tendencies.

This year, the three main bathing dates of the Kumbh Mela 2013 are 14 January, 10 February and 15 February, 2013.

Millions of people from around the globe are expected to participate and be witness to this divine and festive event.


